2010 RALPH ERSKINE PRIZE



The Swedish Association of Architects manages the funds bequeathed by Ralph Erskine, and every three years selects the winner of the prize that bears his name. This year, in its eighth edition, the prize was awarded to Alfredo Brillembourg and Hubert Klumpner for their work entirely dedicated to improving housing and living conditions in the poorest communities. They founded the Urban Ideas Laboratory in Caracas, Venezuela, and are currently working in Sao Paulo, Brazil, and New York, USA. They teach at Columbia University in the USA, and at the Zurich Technical Institute in Switzerland. The last Ralph Erskine prize recognised British architect Andrew Freear for his work with Rural Studio at Auburn University in Alabama.

ARCHITECTURAL EDUCATION COMMISSION

OECD COMPENDIUM OF EXEMPLARY EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES

The UIA Architectural Education Commission is collaborating with the OECD's Center for effective learning environments in the publication of the fourth edition of their Compendium of exemplary educational facilities. A jury was set up to select the establishments that will appear in the compendium from among the 166 realisations identified by the OECD member countries. Sungjung Chough, co-director of the UIA AE Commission, participated in the jury along with Rodolfo Almeida, former Director of UNESCO's architecture for education section, and José Freire da Silva, member of the UIA Educational and Cultural Spaces work programme. Among the 60 projects selected for publication, prizes were awarded to six realisations. The Fuji kindergarten in Tachikawa City, Japan, designed and built by architects Takaharu Tezuka and Yui Tezuka, received unanimous praise and the jury's first prize.

Five projects received an Aga Khan Award for Architecture in 2010: the territory planning project for Wadi Hanifa wetlands in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, by Moriyama & Teshima Planners and Buro Happold; the revitalisation plan for the Tunis hypercentre, Tunisia, realised by the Association for the preservation of the Tunis Medina; Madinat Al-Zahra museum in Cordoba, Spain, by Nieto Sobejano Architects; Ipekyol textile factory in Erdine, Turkey, by Emre Arolat Architects; the bridge-school, Xiashi, Fujian, China, by Li Xiaodong studio.

Initiated in 1977 by His Highness the Aga Khan, these awards honour and encourage excellence in architectural and built environment realisations in communities where Muslims have a signigicant presence. The awards ceremony took place in Doha, Qatar, on 24 November 2010. Louise Cox was among the list of prestigious guests.
